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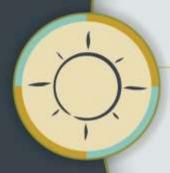

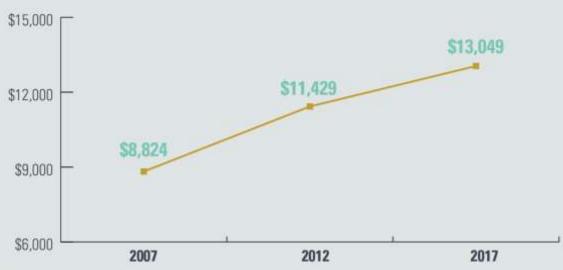

# Employers Are Invested in Their Employees' Health and Well-being

According to the Kaiser Family Foundation, employer contribution toward annual health insurance premiums has increased 48% since 2007.<sup>1,a</sup>

Study Design: The Kaiser Family Foundation (Kaiser) and the Health Research & Educational Trust (HRET) conduct an annual survey of private and nonfederal public employers with 3 or more workers. Information reflects employer-sponsored health benefits in 2017.

Employers offering health benefits also offer a variety of supplemental and other health benefits to their workers.<sup>1</sup>



## Population Health Management and Employee Health

Population health management (PHM) is the latest evolution of employee care management.<sup>2</sup>

# Prevention Is a Key Component of Population Health Management<sup>7</sup>

Evidence-based preventive services can potentially improve health by identifying risk factors and diseases early, managing them more effectively, and treating them before they develop into more complicated conditions.<sup>8,9</sup>

#### Vaccines Are a Part of Preventive Health Care



VACCINATION IS AN EVIDENCE-BASED PREVENTIVE STRATEGY that can help protect your eligible employee population against certain diseases. 11,12



AS AN EMPLOYER, you may be able to play a role in improving vaccination rates.<sup>13</sup>

THE ACIP provides recommendations for the vaccination of appropriate adults.14

For updated ACIP recommendations, non-grandfathered plans must provide coverage in the next plan year that is no more than 12 months after the recommendation is adopted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.



## A Variety of Barriers May Prevent Adult Vaccination<sup>15</sup>

In a June 2011 report, the NVAC defined different types of barriers to adult vaccination.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL**

- Access to health care services
- Knowledge about the need for vaccination
- Time to vaccinate



#### **OPERATIONAL**

 Coordination of vaccine activities, reminders, and assessments

#### **FINANCIAL**

- Costs associated with purchasing vaccines
- Variable and potentially inadequate reimbursement to providers for vaccines
- · Potential patient out-of-pocket costs

vaccinations in broader employee population health efforts

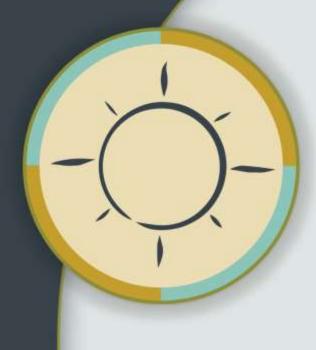

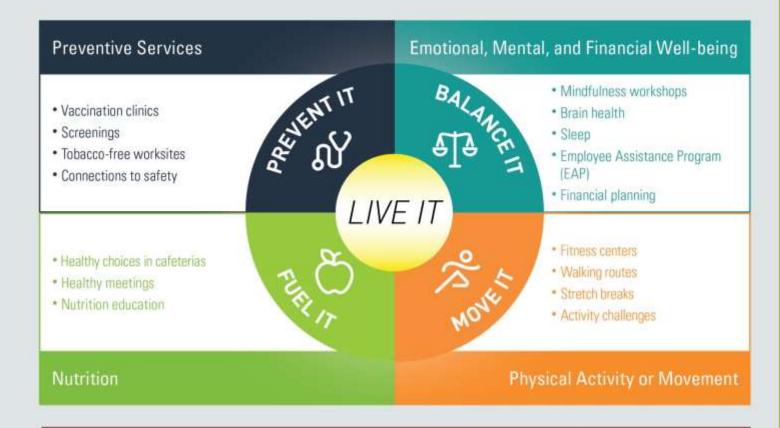

#### Merck On-site Health Clinics

Merck offers on-site clinics. These clinics are offered at 8 different locations, each of which:

- Is fully staffed with:
  - Physician, registered nurse, and/or nurse practitioner
- Has a primary focus on occupational health and wellness screenings
- Provides year-round routine and travel vaccinations
- Promotes and manages on-site vaccination campaigns

# Merck Includes Adult Vaccination as a Pharmacy Benefit for Employees



IN 2011, adult vaccinations were added to the pharmacy benefit in addition to the medical benefit for Merck employees. The pharmacy coverage for vaccines works similarly to the coverage process for other prescriptions.



**ONE GOAL** of expanding the vaccination program through the pharmacy benefit was to enable field-based employees without ready access to an on-site clinic to obtain appropriate vaccinations.

Consider including all 3 components as described by the Department of Labor<sup>17</sup>:







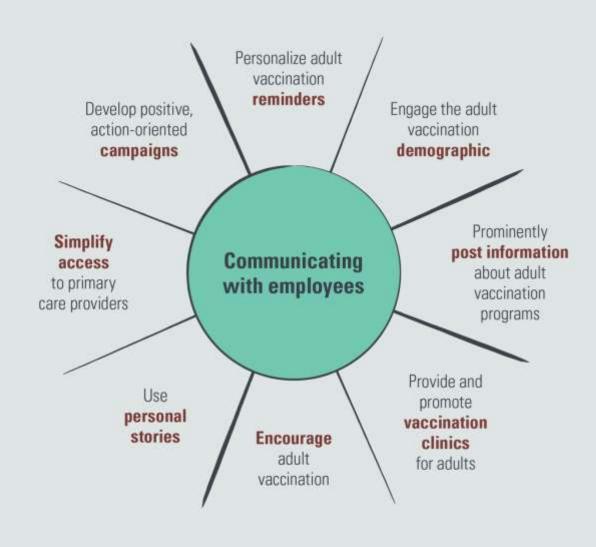
Employers can improve vaccination rates by **promoting vaccinations and making** them convenient and accessible, including offering on-site clinics.<sup>13</sup>

Dual coverage under medical and pharmacy benefits may make vaccination more accessible for employees and their family members.<sup>18</sup>
